

## Obtaining the Florida Agents Property & Casualty License (220 License)

### Qualifications

1. Must be at least 18 years old
2. Resident of Florida
3. **Successfully complete a 200 hour pre-licensing insurance course.** Classroom courses are available in various ways to meet your needs including weekly classes, weekend classes or online courses. ### Getting Started

Step 1. Apply Online with the Florida Department of Financial services [https://aalf.fldfs.com/common/com\\_index.asp](https://aalf.fldfs.com/common/com_index.asp)

Step 2. Submit a set of fingerprints. Florida residents applying for the 1<sup>st</sup> time with the Department must submit a set of fingerprints via the Live Scan process. Live Scan fingerprints are available at many locations throughout Florida. To locate an office nearest you visit [www.flprints.com](http://www.flprints.com) or call (877) 357-7456. Live Scan fingerprinting fees are paid directly to the Live Scan vendor, and not to the Department.

Step 3. The Department will notify you when you have been approved, and will mail you an Examination Authorization Notice. You may also check the Department of Financial Services Web site, ([www.fldfs.com](http://www.fldfs.com)) to determine if you have been authorized for an examination.

Step 4. Sign up for either a classroom pre-licensing 200 hour course or an online self study course. For a list of classes or online courses please visit the Florida Department of Financial Services website ([https://dice.fldfs.com/public/pb\\_srch\\_adv.asp](https://dice.fldfs.com/public/pb_srch_adv.asp)). Upon completing the course you will receive a certificate showing completion of your classroom hours.

Step 5. Sign up and make reservations for the state license exam by either:

- Visiting Promissor (exam company) online [www.promissor.com](http://www.promissor.com) or;
- Call Promissor and schedule an exam at (888) 274-2020.

Step 6. You will know if you passed the exam before you leave the test center (a grade of 70% or better is passing).
